NASLOV IN OPIS PREDAVANJA:

**The transitioning nature of cultural geographies and cultural studies of settlements in relation to the impacting effects of climate change**

Transitioning to a more sustainable and robust planet requires some radical re-thinking and practice in terms of what we think is acceptable. What we think is worthy of cultural as well as biological honor, comes into play in how imagine new cities and settlements that are kinder to Earth and more respectful of its citizens. However, current planetary rates of population growth and associated industrial, military and agricultural development already exceed what the natural environment, changing weather patterns and clean water supply can sustain (Stockholm Resilience Centre: Nine Planetary Boundaries). This is both a global and local (g/local) issue that requires critical and collaborative review at all levels of the social stratum. The notion of 'in-migration' (Kumer and Hawke 2024) is particularly relevant to how small communities and countries like Slovenia approach the future proofing of life on earth. By putting theory robustly into local geographic practice, and collaboration with key stakeholders such as governance and business, citizen and academic scientists, new conditions of possibility not only arise, but can meet the challenges of the this Anthropocene era that we find ourselves in.
